Research networks

APA supports multiple practice-based academic research networks focused on pediatric residency clinics (CORNET), in-patient settings (PRIS), and newborns (BORN).

• Journal

Academic Pediatrics, the official peer-reviewed journal of the APA published eight times a year.

• Young Investigator Awards

Fellows or junior faculty can apply for research funding focused on child health promotion, health services, education, or patient care.

• Pediatric Policy Council

The APA works with the Pediatric Policy Council on legislative advocacy efforts of academic pediatric community.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Develop the skills and scholarship you need to advance child health.

• Scholarship Faculty Development Programs for Education, Research, and Quality and Safety Improvement Science

The APA offers faculty development programs to increase scholarship in education, quality safety and improvement, and research. The three-year programs provide curriculum and mentorship.

• Environmental Health Scholars Meeting

This two-day meeting provides pediatric environmental health fellows with intensive mentoring and guided feedback on their scholarly work.

Academic Fellows Meeting

Academic General Pediatric and Hospital Medicine fellows, program directors, and leaders in medical graduate education meet at PAS to focus on professional development, research, education, quality improvement, and/or advocacy.

Quality Improvement Science Meeting

This one-day annual meeting, at PAS, focuses on methodological and technical issues of importance in the field of pediatric health care quality improvement research.

• Awards and Recognition

The APA proudly recognizes its members annually for their outstanding contributions to the pediatric community through its awards program.



• Board of Directors

APA's Board of Directors provides strategic thought leadership to the organization. Members may apply for open positions and, if elected, contribute to the achievement of the organization's mission and vision.

• Committees and Task Forces

APA members contribute their time, expertise, and leadership in carrying out the organization's activities through an annual call for leadership opportunities.

• Region & Special Interest Group (SIG) Chairs

Each APA SIG and Region has a team of chairs. Members can gain leadership experience on a regional or national level by serving their SIG or region.

MENTORSHIP

Develop meaningful relationships with national colleagues to help you navigate your institution and career choices.

- Advancing Pediatric Educator Excellence (APEX) Teaching Program The APEX teaching program offers curriculum in educational theory and mentoring for academic pediatric hospitalists.
- Fellows Peer-Mentoring

This program helps facilitate collaboration between fellows at different institutions; second or 3rd year fellows serve as mentors to 1st year fellows.

New Century Scholars Mentoring Program

This two-year mentorship program for underrepresented minorities aims to increase the diversity of the academic pediatric workforce. Program participation is competitive and is only open to individuals in their second year of residency.

• Scholarship Faculty Development Programs for Education, Research, and Quality and Safety Improvement Science

APA's faculty development programs increase scholarship through a three-year curriculum and local and national mentorship.

• Speed Mentoring

A fast-paced networking session offered at APA's annual meetings and designed for attendees to meet, learn, and connect with experienced leaders in academic pediatrics.
